**HISTORY:**

Aurie, a 4 year old male Doberman pinscher, presented on April 5, 2016 to the Cardiology Service at the University of Georgia for a pre-breeding screening. Aurie has been doing well at home with a normal appetite, activity level and no changes in urination or defecation. He is not currently receiving any medication and has no major medical history.

**PHYSICAL EXAMINATION:**

Weight: 41.4 kg (91 lbs)  
Temperature: 97.9 axillary  
Pulse: 114 beats/minute  
Respiratory rate: panting/eupneic

Aurie was bright, alert and responsive upon examination. He appeared adequately hydrated with normal skin turgor and moist mucus membranes. He had a full, shiny haircoat with minimal flaking and no evidence of ectoparasites. No ocular or nasal discharge was present. His ears were clean with no signs of irritation. No crackles, wheezes or other abnormal lung sounds were heard. Cardiac auscultation was normal. Abdomen was soft, non-painful and non-distended with no organomegaly or masses appreciated. Aurie was well muscled and ambulated normally on all four limbs. All palpable lymph nodes were normal in size and character.

**DIAGNOSTICS:**

Echocardiogram: normal systolic function, no signs of dilated cardiomyopathy (DCM)

**ASSESSMENT:**

Aurie looks great today! His echocardiogram was normal with no signs of DCM at this time.

**FOLLOW-UP:**

1. We appreciate your vigilance in screening Aurie for early signs of DCM as there are medications that may be given as soon as dogs are diagnosed with this disease that may slow the progression. Therefore, we would recommend annual screenings to determine if any early signs of DCM develop.
